Our curriculum is underpinned by our RESPECT VALUES, which are covered across all subjects. The following values are exemplified in this subject:

Sequence of Learning

Early years: In EYFS, we use different medium to enhance our skills, children study a range of artists linked to our local area.

KS1 and KS2, skills are taught discreetly, through the formal elements of Art. All new units include knowledge organisers which are stuck into the sketchbooks at the start of the unit.
