Our curriculum is underpinned by our RESPECT VALUES, which are covered across all subjects. The following values are exemplified in this subject:

Resilience: Children learn about the value of resilience through selected texts. They persevere in their reading to develop reading stamina.

Empathy: Through narrative reading, children see through the eyes of other people, by imagining and experiencing the thoughts and feelings of diverse characters in stories, poetry and playscripts.

Self-awareness: Reading books in which people are going through similar experiences to us, encourages self-reflection.

Positivity: Reading for pleasure helps children feel happy and self-confident.

Excellence: By supporting children to read fluently, confidently and with a secure understanding they can learn from the best.

Communication: Discussion about their reading helps our children to listen to explore and expand their ideas.

Teamwork: Children explore their reading collaboratively using DEAL.

Sequence of Learning

Early years: Reception follows the Statutory framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage and Development Matters. Communication and language are prioritised as the bedrock of future success in reading and the means to acquire knowledge and communicate clearly in a range of subjects. Our SSP, Rocket Phonics, sequences key reading skills in EYFS/Reception and KS1. Class texts are rich and diverse.

KS1: Each class in KS1 & KS2 has a long-term and medium-term plan in English. Progression through the year groups is planned for, to ensure that vocabulary, fluency, and understanding are built upon year on year.

KS2: Older pupils read with developing stamina from a range of more sophisticated texts.
