#### GENERAL INFORMATION

- Building fluency and comprehension is key
- Reading VIPERS
- Relating reading to real-life contexts and the wider world.
- Accelerated Reader





#### **READING**

- Vital that you are not solely focussed on the school reading scheme
- Reading for pleasure to create life long learners

- Ask your child to tell you a summary of the story or text they have read
- Describe the character
- Predict what will happen next
- Develop skills of inference and deduction





#### WRITING

In Year 4, your child will continue to develop across the different strands of writing:

- imagination and ideas
- audience and purpose
- handwriting
- spelling
- grammar
- punctuation





#### WHITE ROSE MATHS

- We use White Rose Maths supplemented by NCETM and NRICH
- Keep up not catch up
- Schofield & Sims Mental Arithmetic books will be sent home after a baseline assessment
- Encourage your child to make jottings and to develop a range of mental strategies
- See booklet for areas of maths

### DEAL - DRAMA ENGAGEMENT ACTIVE LEARNING

- Engage children in their learning through memorable experiences, inspiring them to develop skills throughout the curriculum by firing their imaginations.
- Enhance speaking & listening skills through creative, fun activities that also develop thinking and writing skills.
- Encourage inclusivity and build up the confidence of all children through collaborative learning opportunities.




## MULTIPLICATION TABLES CHECK (MTC)


- The Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) is a key stage 2 assessment to be taken by pupils at the end of Year 4 (in June)
- The purpose of the MTC is to make sure the times tables knowledge is at the expected level
- The MTC is an online test where the pupils are asked 25 questions on times tables 2 to 12
- For every question you have 6 seconds to answer and in between the questions there is a 3-second rest
- Questions about the 6, 7, 8, 9, and 12 times table come up more often


















## ASSESS YOUR YEAR 4S' MTC-READINESS

#### NTS – TERMLY ASSESSMENTS

- Children take tests in Reading Comprehension, Maths, Spelling and Grammar each term and they also carry out independent writing tasks which are teacher assessed
- Science is teacher assessed at the end of every topic.
- We undertake a range of assessments throughout the year, some formal and others informal, to track your child's attainment and progress and to help inform our teaching.
